1. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Poland is analyzing the possibility of making changes to national laws regarding fees paid by third-country nationals for granting residence permits. Currently, under Polish law, a third-country national who applies for a residence permit (temporary residence permit, permanent residence permit and long-term EU resident permit) is required to pay two fees – a stamp duty and an administrative fee.

We would like to ask the following questions:

1. We would like to ask the following questions: 1. What type of fees and in what amount do the national laws of the Member States provide for the granting of residence permits and the issuance of residence permits? 2 Are these fees charged for the granting of residence permits or the issuance of residence permits, or for the mere possibility of submitting an application regardless of whether the permit is granted by the competent authority?

	EMN NCP Belgium	Yes	<p>1. On the website of the Belgian Immigration Office (https://dofi.ibz.be/en/themes/faq/contribution-fee) an overview of contribution fees can be found. Contribution fees cover the administrative costs for processing an application for residence. If the residence is granted, another fee needs to be paid for the residence card itself (production costs). This fee is determined by the Federal Public Service Home Affairs. The fees for 2024 can be found here: https://www.ibz.rrn.fgov.be/fileadmin/user_upload/nl/kaarten/eid/omzendbrieven/Eid_Omzendbrief_Tarieven_2024_NL.pdf. But most municipalities levy a tax on this fee. The price for the issuance of a residence card can defer from one municipality to another, because the taxes that municipalities levy can defer from one municipality to another. Fees are charged for the mere possibility of submitting an application. The fee must always be paid to apply for residency. If refused, it cannot be reclaimed. In the event of a positive decision, there is an additional cost for the card itself, but in the event of refusal, this is obviously not the case as no card will be issued.</p>

To grant the right of prolonged residence to a third-country national in the Republic of Bulgaria on the basis of student, a fee of BGN 100 is collected. To grant the right of prolonged residence to a third-country national on the basis residence permit and work, a fee of BGN 110 is collected. A fee of BGN 110 is collected for the authorization of a third-country national long-term residence in the Republic of Bulgaria. The third-country national, staying for a long-term, prolonged residence, permanently in the Republic of Bulgaria, shall certify their right to stay in the Republic of Bulgaria with a residence permit according to the requirements of Council Regulation (EC) No 1030/2002 of 13 June 2002 laying down a uniform format for residence permits for third-country nationals and the fee for issuing a document is BGN 40.</p> <p>Question 2: No</p>

In Croatia, an administrative fee is also payable when the application for an approved temporary stay is submitted in the territory of the Republic of Croatia, in the case when the application is approved, and it amounts to EUR 46.45.
